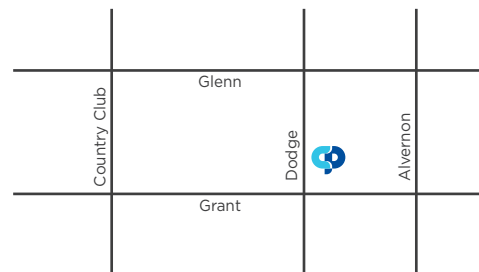
Our expertise provides individuals with serious mental illness and their families the support and rehabilitation services they need to achieve long-term housing stability as a foundation for recovery.

Easily accessible on bus routes 9 and 11.



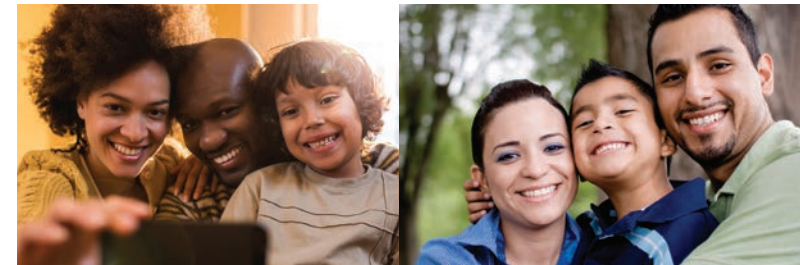

## Long-term housing stability as a foundation for recovery



As southern Arizona's former Regional Behavioral Health Authority and a leader in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Continuum of Care program, we bring significant knowledge and experience with state and federal housing programs and evidence-based practices, such as the Housing First model, which promotes easy access to housing, encourages client choice, and acknowledges housing stability as essential for recovery.

### What we offer:

- Development of client-driven goals to promote housing stability
- Advocacy for safe and affordable housing opportunities
- Client-centered supports, including family and peer support, and personal care
- Life skills, training, employment support and other rehabilitation services
- Coordination of care with other health care providers
- Financial assistance with rental payments, ensuring members pay no more than 30% of their income, with no minimum

## Housing opportunities

In conjunction with our property management division, Mental Health Resources, Inc. (MHRI), CPCC offers rental subsidies to help individuals with serious mental illness and their families maintain housing. MHRI manages over 144 housing units available to those with serious mental illness.

CPCC also administers over 275 HUD Continuum of Care-funded subsidies for individuals with serious mental illness who have been homeless, and their families. Members can use these subsidies for apartments of their choice throughout the community. Vacancies are prioritized for households with the highest medical vulnerability and/or history of homelessness as assessed by the Vulnerability Index tool (VI-SPDAT). CPCC also offers specialized rental assistance and support for young adults (ages 18-24) in our 10-unit Sonrisa complex.

## Referrals

CPCC works with Cenpatico's intake agencies to provide comprehensive housing services for their members.

Please contact Cenpatico if you are interested in making a referral to CPCC for housing or housing support services. Cenpatico can direct you through the referral process, which depends on the status of the member and their intake agency placement.
